

Back to England Again – by Classic England

Friday 27th May	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Parham Airfield Museum: Dedicated as a tribute to the endeavours of the 390th Bomb Group, 8th U.S. Army Air Force and other Allied airmen operating from bases throughout East Anglia. • Lunch at Parham Airfield Museum • Guided tour of Cambridge and colleges including Kings Chapel: An expert local guide will show you the key sites of interest in the famous university town on the River Cam. • Group dinner at The Eagle in Cambridge : This pub dates from 1667 and is owned by Corpus Christie College. The RAF bar ceiling is covered in graffiti created by airmen from both RAF and USAAF in WWII.
Saturday 28th May	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 11am service at Nuthampstead • Lunch at The Woodman: Many original photographs and memorabilia of the 398th Bomber Group. • Official opening of the Hunter Building of the Nuthampstead Airfield Museum: The additional Hunter building will provide a facility for public education of the 8th Air Force 398th Bomb Group and the 55th Fighter Group and attached units and of these organizations activities and roles in the national defence.
Sunday 29th May	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Church service at St. George's Anstey: Beautiful 12th Century church with stained glass window with names inscribed of 398th Bomb Group members who were killed in action while stationed at Nuthampstead. • Group A: American Air Museum and the Duxford Spring Air Show: The museum tells the story of transatlantic collaboration between the UK and USA and houses the largest collection of American military aircraft outside the USA. The visit includes the famous Spring Air Show with many WWII aircraft. Those not wishing to see the air show can join group B today and visit Duxford tomorrow. • Group B: Free time to explore Cambridge: Relax in a tearoom or wander through the museums, shops and colleges.
